TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

John Chapter 8

Context: Setting the Table

After introducing the witnesses to Jesus and describing a variety of initial responses to the launch of his ministry, John recorded the beginnings of Jesus's controversy with the leaders in chapters five and six. This eighth chapter continues from chapter seven the account of Jesus's visit to Jerusalem at the Feast of Tabernacles in the face of ever-increasing hostility.

Content: Hearing the Text

Read John 8 together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

Jesus was and is the true light of the world. Only through him can sinful humans experience true freedom from sin and true deliverance from the death that sin always brings. All who refuse to believe that he is God's only plan of redemption will face eternal judgment. Yet though he knew all of this, Jesus consistently refused to seek his own glory. Even as he faced the shameful "lifting up" of the crucifixion, he knew that he could trust the Father to vindicate and glorify him in the Father's own time. So can we.

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

Discuss the meaning of the text and then walk through the following application questions as you discuss the difference this meaning ought to make in our lives today.

Like the Jews of Jesus's day we can be unwilling to see ourselves as the problem with the world. What are some of the ways in which this universal human tendency can manifest itself in our own lives?

Jesus was and is the only hope of humanity, yet he resolutely refused to seek his own glory, knowing that true glory always comes from the Father and in the Father's own time. How might we be tempted to use Jesus's name to seek a glory that is disconnected from the purposes and plans of the Father?

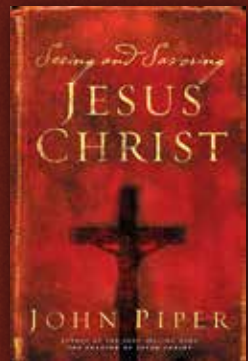

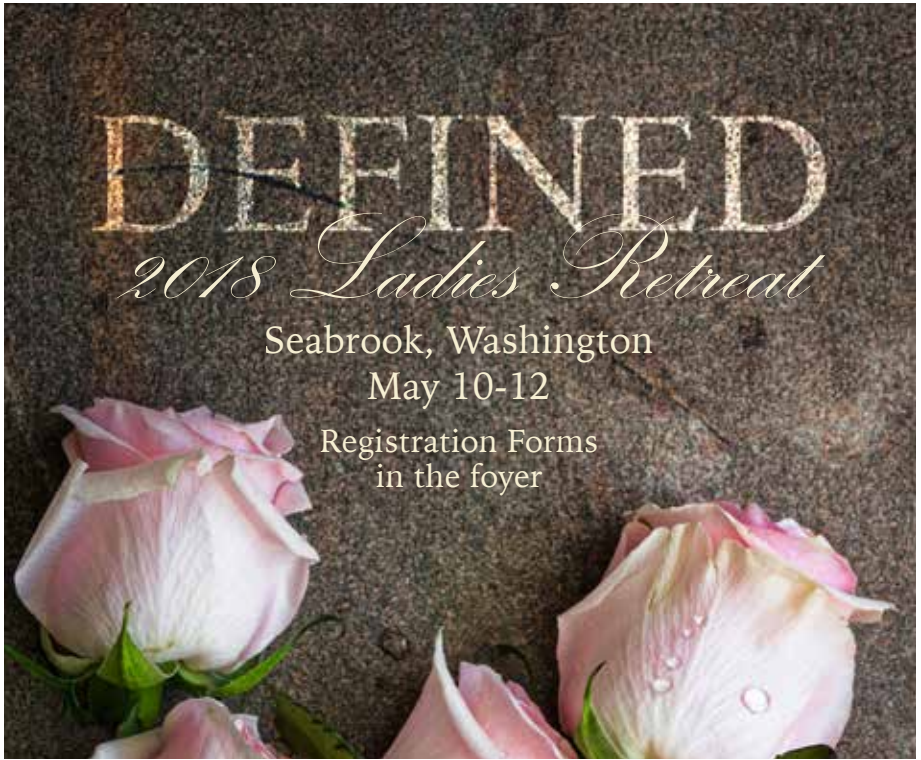
