TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

John Chapter 11

Context: Setting the Table

The first four chapters of John's Gospel introduce the witnesses to Jesus, describe his first two signs, and depict a variety of initial responses to the launch of his ministry. Chapters five through ten record the next three signs and the increasing hostility that Jesus faced, particularly from the Jerusalem leadership. This eleventh chapter records the raising of Lazarus, the final sign before the coming of Jesus's own "hour."

Content: Hearing the Text

Read John 11 together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

Although Jesus could have healed his dear friend Lazarus from afar, he allowed him to die. In restoring Lazarus to life, Jesus pointed forward to a reality far greater than the few extra years of earthly life he was given. Jesus himself would soon be dead, wrapped in grave clothes, lying with a covered face in a stone-sealed tomb. Yet when the Father raised Jesus out from among the dead, he did not simply restore him to the life that Lazarus regained. He raised him as the first-fruits of the resurrection, the in-breaking of the new creation and it is this everlasting, never stopping, grave-defeating life that the resurrection of Jesus guarantees to all who belong to him. No follower of Jesus will only live once.

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

Discuss the meaning of the text and then walk through the following application questions as you discuss the difference this meaning ought to make in our lives today.

In order for God's glory in Christ to be more fully unveiled, Lazarus had to die. What would you be willing to go through to see God glorified?

No true follower of Christ will only live once. Do you believe this? More importantly, do the priorities of your life reflect what you claim to believe?

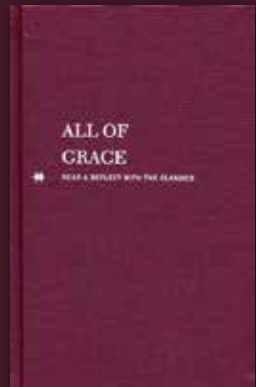

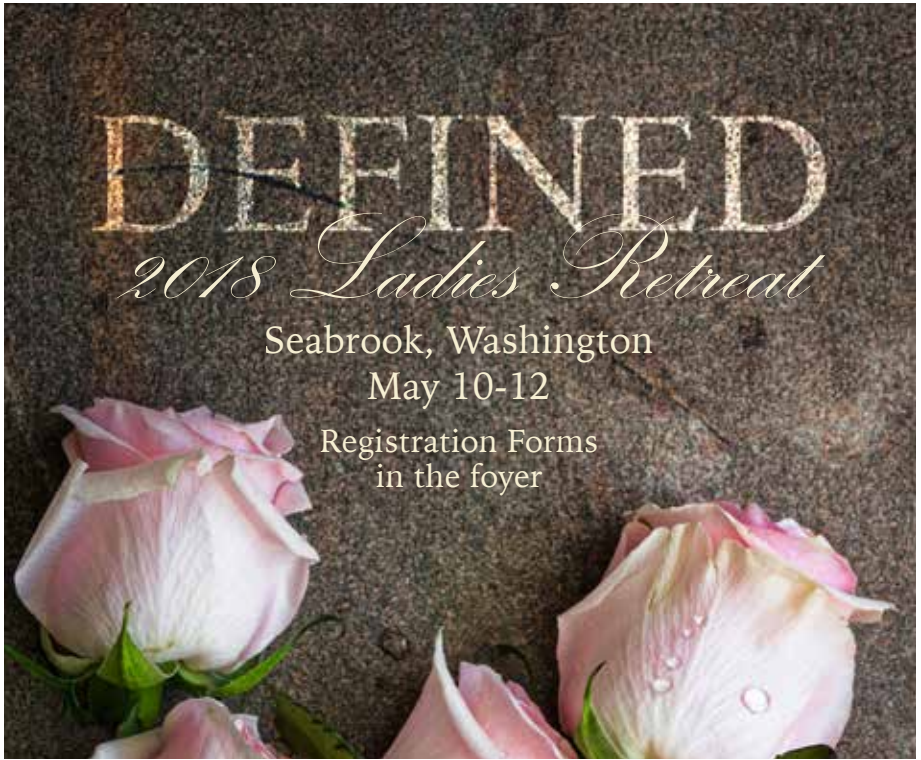
