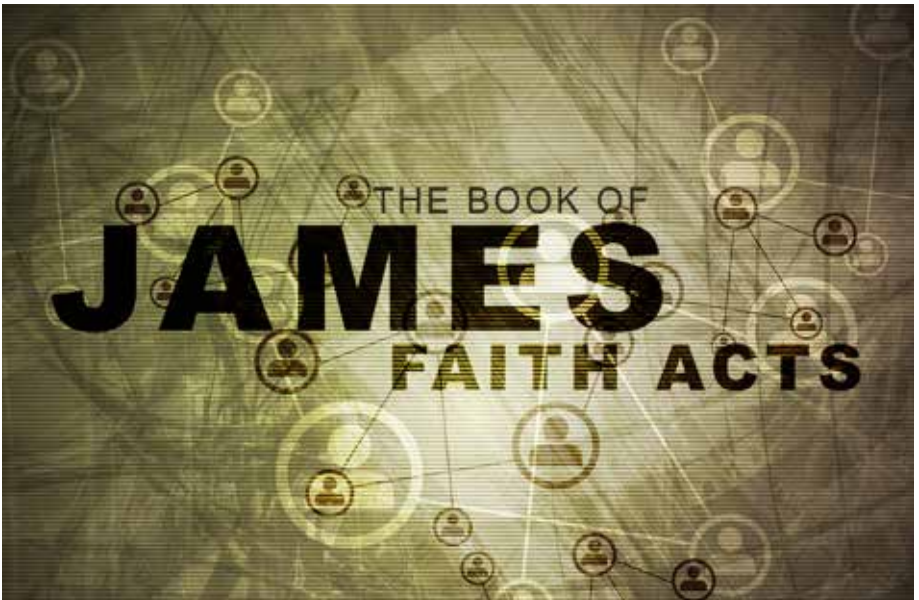

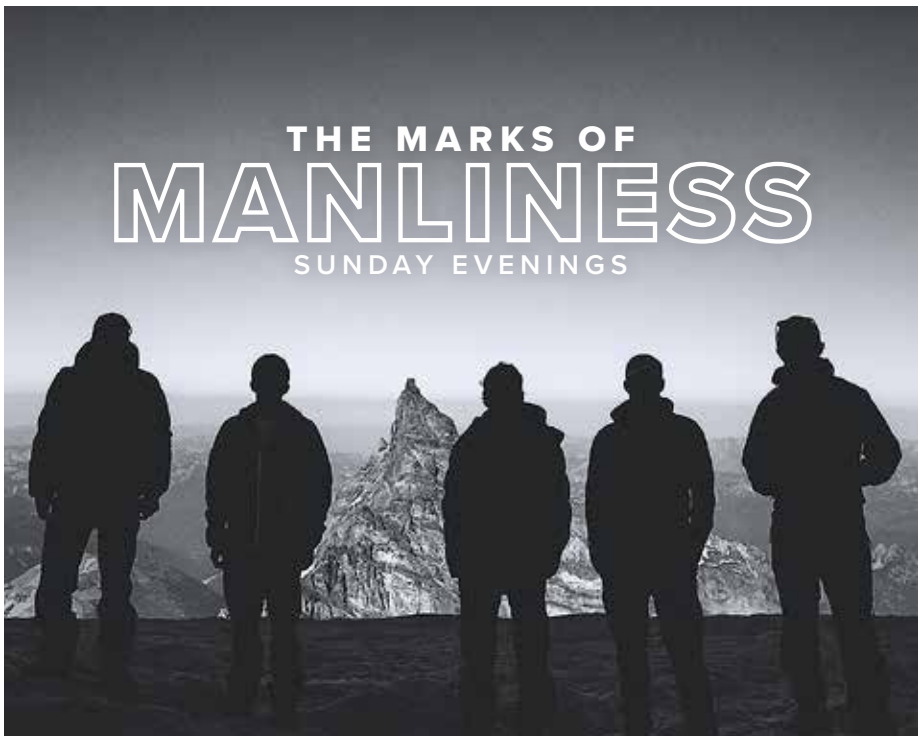

TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

John Chapter 16

Context: Setting the Table

After introducing the witnesses to Jesus in chapter one, John recorded the public ministry of Jesus in chapters two through eleven. Chapter twelve summarizes Christ's public ministry and marks the coming of his long-awaited "hour." This sixteenth chapter concludes Jesus's farewell discourse, begun in chapter thirteen. As the time of his own departure came ever nearer, Jesus continued to pour himself into his disciples, preparing them for the dark days to come.

Content: Hearing the Text

Read John 16 together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

Jesus knew that difficult days were coming for his disciples. The hatred that the world directed toward him during his earthly ministry would be turned on them. They would be tempted to stop following Jesus, to turn their back on their Master. They needed to know that the departure of Jesus did not mean that he would be absent. On the contrary, through the work of the Comforter, the presence of Jesus would only be intensified. Though the disciples would experience deep sorrow in the "time in-between," their sorrow would be turned into joy. In the moment, they would not understand. They would be scattered. Yet failure would not be the end of their story, or ours. Jesus has overcome the world, and given his disciples, then and now, a peace that nothing can destroy.

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

Discuss the meaning of the text and then walk through the following application questions as you discuss the difference this meaning ought to make in our lives today.

What are some ways in which we are needlessly surprised by the opposition of the world?

How might we be tempted to assume prematurely that we understand everything we need to know?

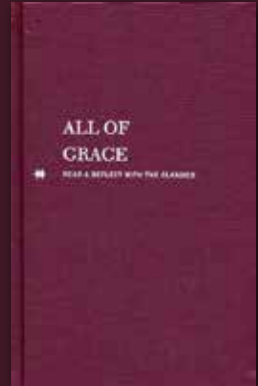
