

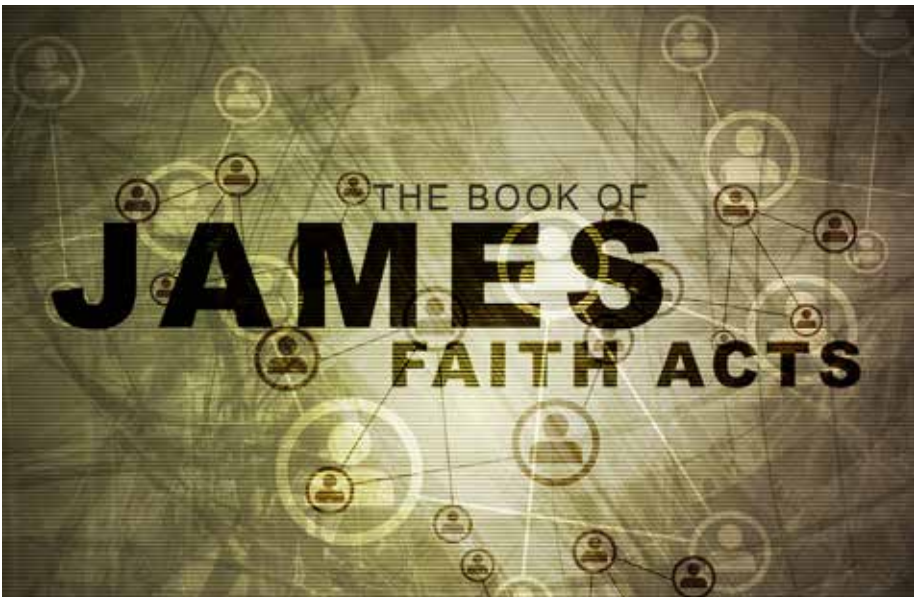

TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

John Chapter 19

Context: Setting the Table

In his first twelve chapters, John introduced the witnesses to Jesus and described his public ministry, including his first six signs and the increasing opposition these signs led to. Chapters thirteen through seventeen record Jesus's preparation of his disciples for his soon coming departure. Continuing from chapter eighteen, this nineteenth chapter contains John's account of the seventh and final sign, the death-and-resurrection of Jesus.

Content: Hearing the Text

Read John 19 together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

The leaders congratulated themselves on accomplishing their goal. Pilate, who proudly claimed the authority over life and death, cared more about his career than his conscience and gave them exactly what they wanted. The execution squad gambled for his garments, reveling in their power over this Jew whose claims to be a king now looked so hollow. Jesus alone knew that what seemed to the world's final victory was in fact the moment of its ultimate defeat. Even as he writhed in agony on a Roman cross, suffering the scorn of men and the wrath of God, he continued to fulfill ancient Scriptures, fully accomplishing the plan of redemption that was and is the only hope of rebellious humanity.

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

Discuss the meaning of the text and then walk through the following application questions as you discuss the difference this meaning ought to make in our lives today.

Though Pilate was clearly fascinated by Jesus, he worshiped his career. How might we imitate Pilate's example, even while professing to be followers of Jesus?

What are some ways we can be tempted to forget that Jesus fully accomplished the Father's plan of redemption?

Examples: Refusing to forgive ourselves for sins whose penalty Jesus has already paid; refusing to turn from sins whose power Jesus has already defeated.

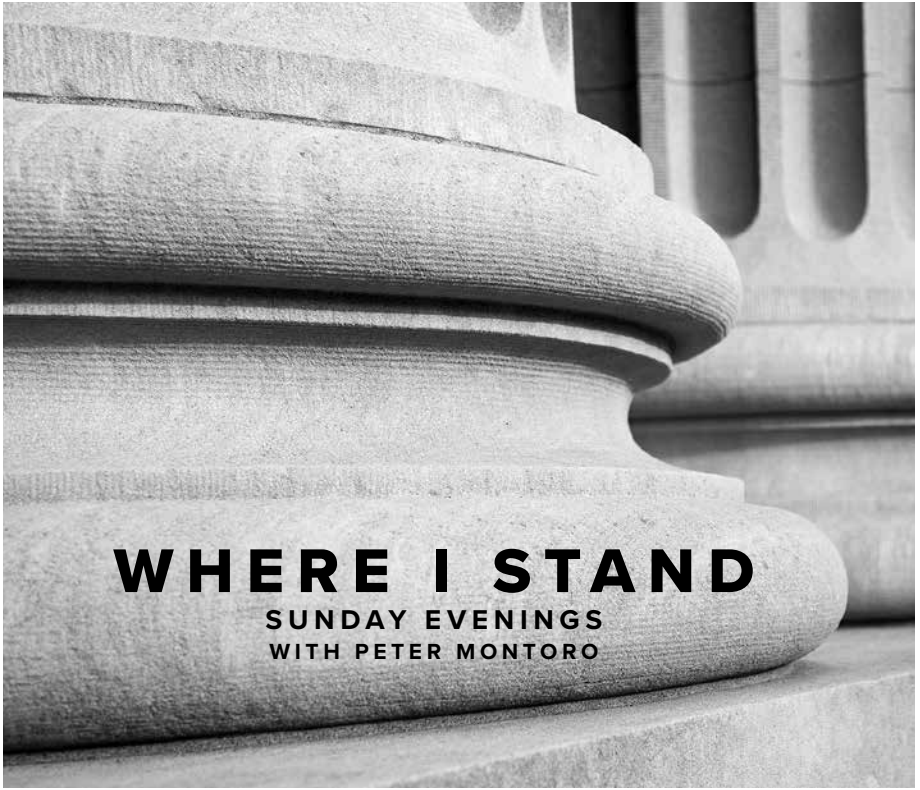
