



TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

John Chapter 21

Context: Setting the Table

In the first chapter of his Gospel, John introduced those who would serve as witnesses to Jesus. Chapters two through twelve describe the public ministry of Jesus, including his first six signs and the increasing opposition these signs led to. Chapters thirteen through seventeen record Jesus's ministry to his disciples as he prepared them for his departure. Chapters eighteen through twenty contain John's account of Jesus's death-and-resurrection—his seventh and final sign. Connecting back to the beginning of the book, this final chapter focuses on the continuing testimony of those who witnessed the seven signs described in this Gospel.

Content: Hearing the Text

Read John 21 together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

The signs were complete. Jesus had proven himself to be the Christ, the very Son of God, the only way to the Father, and the only hope of eternal life. As he concluded his Gospel, John focused once more on the disciples who had witnessed these signs. They needed to be reminded that the command to follow, given at the beginning of the Gospel, still applied at the end. Despite their past failures, they remained the witnesses that God had chosen and their testimony remained vital. Their faithful testimony, preserved for us in Scripture, continues to guarantee the good news that is our only hope. May our witness reflect the faithfulness of theirs!

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

Discuss the meaning of the text and then walk through the following application questions as you discuss the difference this meaning ought to make in our lives today.

Peter had failed, miserably and completely. Yet Jesus wasn't finished with him—not by a long shot. Though his restoration was painful, it was fully successful. How have you been tempted to prematurely conclude that you no longer had any value to Jesus?

What are some ways in which we can allow curiosity about God's plans for our fellow disciples distract us from obediently following Jesus in our own lives?


