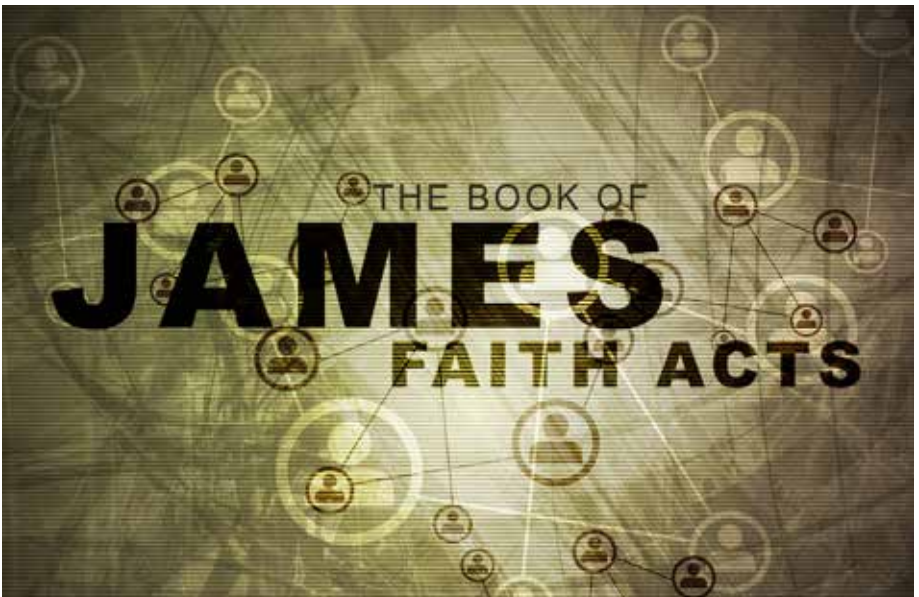

TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

John Summary

Context: Setting the Table

In the first chapter of his Gospel, John introduced those who would serve as witnesses to Jesus. Chapters two through twelve describe the public ministry of Jesus, including his first six signs and the increasing opposition these signs led to. Chapters thirteen through seventeen record Jesus's ministry to his disciples as he prepared them for his departure. Chapters eighteen through twenty contain John's account of Jesus's death-and-resurrection—his seventh and final sign. Connecting back to the beginning of the book, the final chapter focuses on the continuing testimony of those who witnessed the seven signs described in this Gospel.

Content: Hearing the Text

Read selected key passages together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

In the beginning, the Word already was. Before there were stars or planets or time or space, the Word, himself God, was with God. At just the right time, this Word took on flesh in the person of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, for us and for our redemption, entering into the very same time and space that we ourselves inhabit. After gathering a group of faithful witnesses, he performed innumerable signs, fully demonstrating that he was exactly who he claimed to be. After his atoning death, burial, and glorious resurrection, he repeatedly appeared to his chosen witnesses, equipping and commissioning them to testify to all that they had seen. As the end of his life approached, one of these witnesses preserved his testimony to Jesus for us in the pages of this Gospel. Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, he chose to write down seven particular signs, signs that he knew were fully sufficient to lead to life-giving belief for all who would, though them, come to faith in the Word to which they pointed.

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

Discuss the meaning of the text and then walk through the following application questions as you discuss the difference this meaning ought to make in our lives today.

Though we will never write a Gospel, we too are called to be witnesses. How seriously do we take our responsibility to follow Jesus by testifying about him to those who have not yet come to belief?

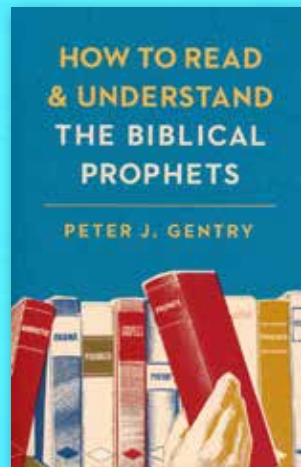
