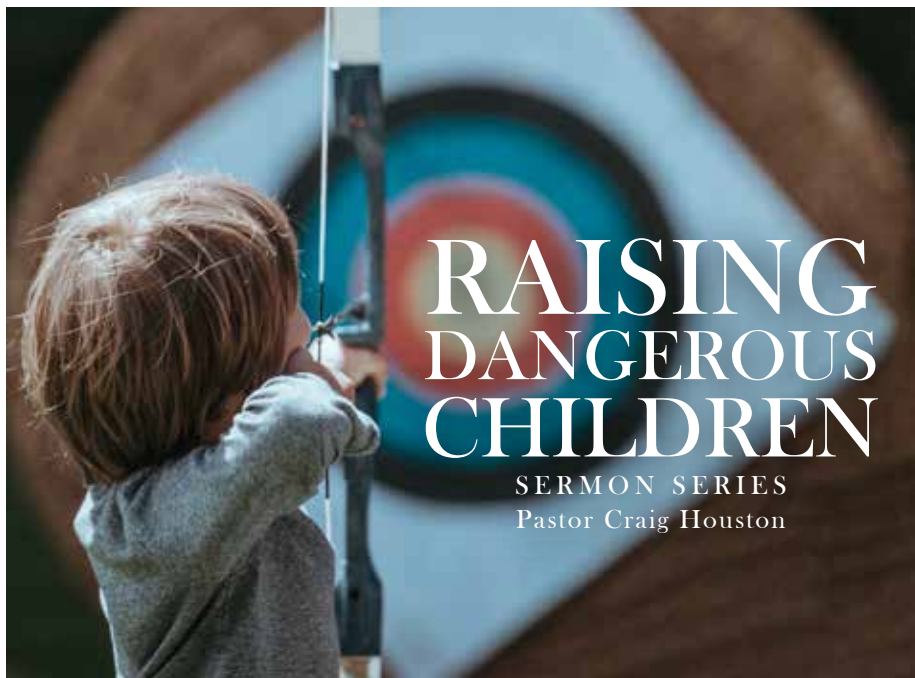

TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

Genesis 27:30–28:09

Context: Setting the Table

Following its magnificent introduction, Genesis divides into two unequal halves of five sections each. The first half of the book (2:4–11:26) deals with the history of humanity as a whole, from its creation to the birth of Abram. The second half of the book (11:27–50:26) focuses on the history of the patriarchs. This section narrates Isaac's failed scheme to secretly bless his favorite son Esau and Rebekah's successful plot to steal Esau's blessing for her favorite son Jacob.

Content: Hearing the Text

Read Genesis 27:30–28:09 together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

While Isaac's peaceful nature had once been his greatest strength, he now sank into passivity and selfishness. Though Rebekah's exuberant hospitality had once seen her characterized as the ideal spouse, her energy and forcefulness were now devoted to manipulative power plays. Esau was dull, violent, and animalistic. Jacob was amoral, deceitful, and conniving. Yet none of these failures could derail God's promise to bless the world through the offspring of Abraham—because that promise was grounded, not in human merit, but in God's own boundless, undeservable, unstoppable and all-transforming grace.

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

Everyone in this story—Isaac, Rebekah, Esau and Jacob alike—engages in behavior that can only be described as horrible. And yet God still accomplished his purposes to preserve a seed until the heir of the Abrahamic promise—Jesus Christ—should be born. What are some of the ways in which we could be tempted to despair of God's promises because of the failures we see in our own or others' lives?

Esau was desperate for his father to give him a blessing as well—but the "blessing" he received turned out to be worse than nothing. What are some of the ways we could be so desperate for a particular good that we end up obtaining the opposite?

Examples: Singles that are so desperate to escape loneliness that they overlook warning signs and end up in a relationship or marriage that leaves them lonelier than ever; Those who so fixate on the obtaining of something they desire that they pay no attention to what they are losing in the process.
