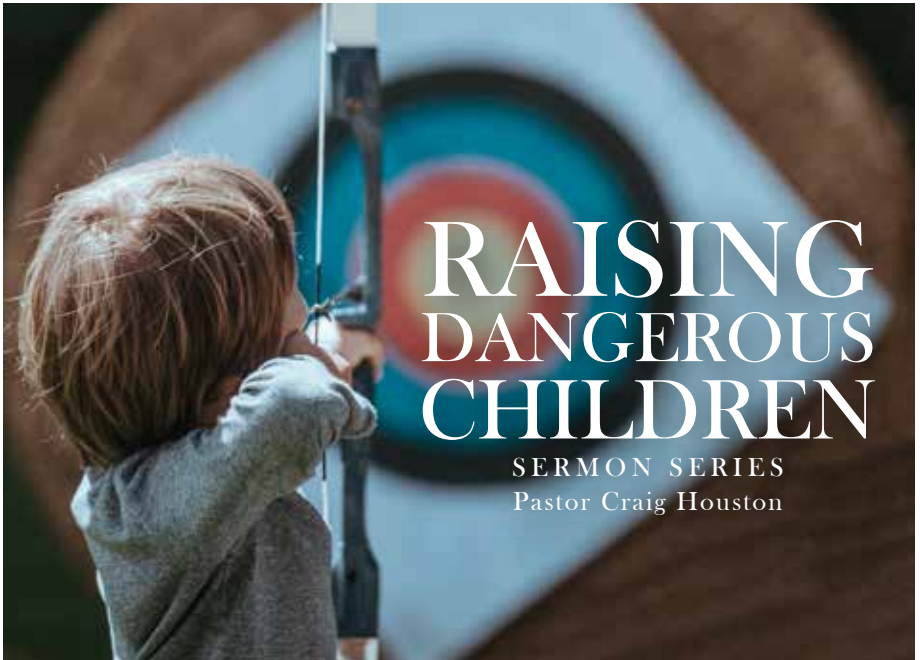

TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

Genesis 31:2–21

Context: Setting the Table

After a creational prologue, Genesis divides into two unequal halves of five sections each. The first half of the book (2:4–11:26) deals with the history of humanity as a whole, from its creation to the birth of Abram. The second half of the book (11:27–50:26) focuses on the history of the patriarchs. In this section, Jacob persuades his wives to flee Haran and is protected by God from Laban's pursuit.

Content: Hearing the Text

Read Genesis 31:2–21 together out loud.

Credo: Believing the Truth

In response to Jacob's unexpected success at stockbreeding, Laban simply used his position of power to arbitrarily and repeatedly change the terms of their agreement. Yet though Laban's treachery may have been more than a match for Jacob's diligence and cleverness, he couldn't even begin to compete with the power of Jacob's God. When Jacob, in obedience to a divine command, finally made his escape from Haran, he was miraculously protected from his pursuing uncle. To the God whose promises could not be thwarted by even the unworthiness of a Jacob, the blusterings of a Laban posed not the slightest of obstacles.

Conduct: Reshaping Our Walk

Although Laban treated Jacob terribly, he still served diligently—and God blessed him for it. How might we be tempted to allow the difficulty of our situation to become an excuse to diminish the diligence of our efforts?

Examples: A "dead-end" job; A difficult boss; A demanding spouse, etc.

Despite Jacob's caution and cleverness, he proved no more a match for Laban than he had been earlier—it was only by God's grace that he left Haran with anything more than the shirt on his back. What are some of the ways we could be tempted to forget just how much we need God's gracious provision?

Examples: Assuming that our good financial planning will protect us in the future; Relying on our own charm and cleverness to get us out of tight spots, etc.

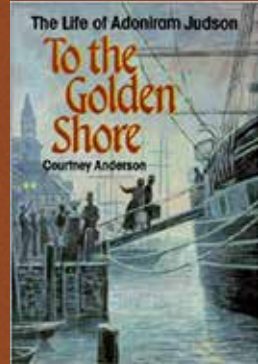

Watching the shoreline disappear from view, they could not have foreseen the impact of their journey on the future of the Christian world mission or on the thousands of men and women who would follow in their footsteps. Drawing on letters and church records, Courtney Anderson paints a poignant portrait of Judson's early life in dealing with the conflict between his desire for material success and the inner call to serve God.
