



TOGETHER IN SCRIPTURE

Exodus 9

Observation (9:3):

No longer in common use, the English word "murrain" (KJV) refers to "Any virulent infectious disease of cattle or other livestock" (OED). In every other instance in which the underlying Hebrew word is found, the KJV renders it as "pestilence."

Application (9:1, 13):

The point of the Exodus was never to eliminate service from the lives of the Children of Israel but rather to free them to serve the Master whose first-born son they were called to be. How might we be tempted to act as though we have been redeemed to pursue our own agenda?

Exodus 10

Observation (10:21):

Pharaoh's agenda has well been described as "anti-creational." It is therefore no surprise that plague after plague depicts the undoing of creation—here the light that God gave in the beginning (Genesis 1:3).

Application (10:8-11; 24-26):

The worship of God demands total dedication of all that we are, all that we have, and all that we hope for. What are some of the areas of our own lives that we might be tempted to allow to "be stayed" from dedication to God by the demands of this world?

Matthew 22:1-22

Observation (22:19):

"Penny" (KJV) translates the Greek word denarius, a Roman silver coin that, based on Matthew 20:2, seems likely to have been worth about a day's wages for a laborer. The English penny (still silver in 1611) was so direct a historical descendant of the denarius that it was traditionally abbreviated as "d."

Application (22:17):

Rather than falling for one side of his enemies' invented political dilemma, Jesus instead had the courage and wisdom to challenge the foolishness of the question. What are some of the situations in our own culture that demand the same response?


